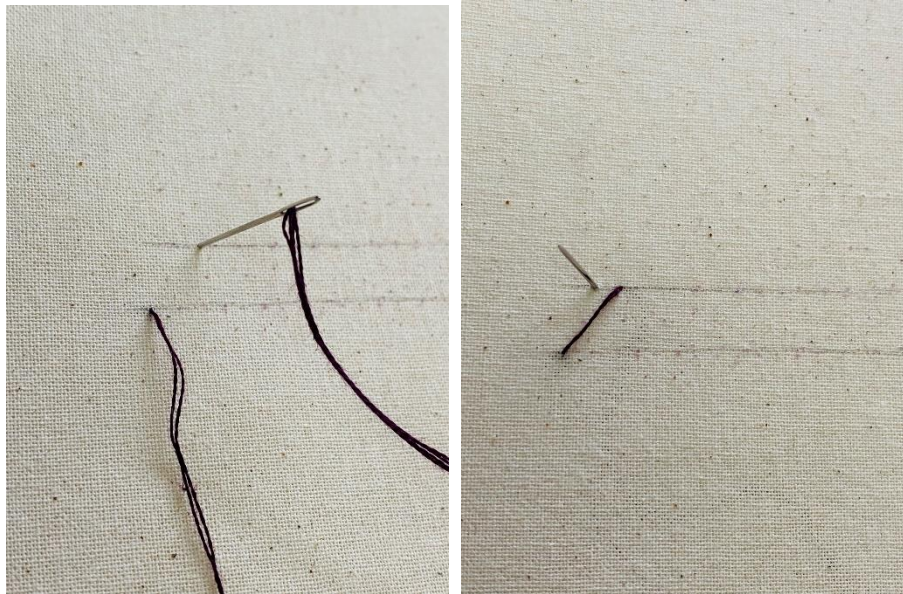


Herringbone Stitch



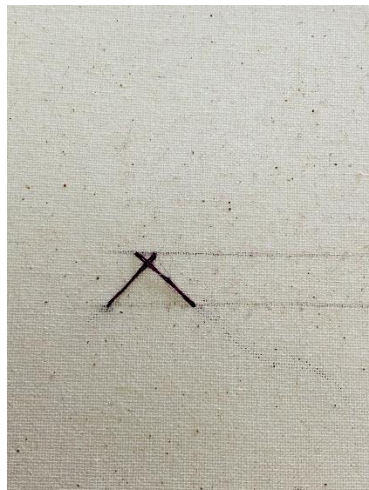
Herringbone stitch is a little like a cross stitch – it's a series of straight stitches, parallel to each other, that cross at the tips.

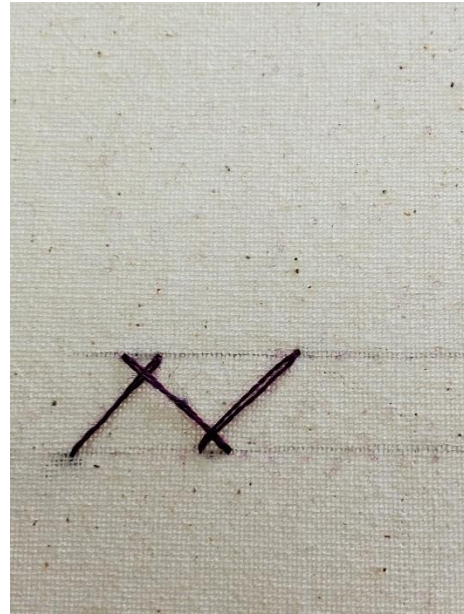
In the photos, Herringbone stitch will be stitched between the two lines

Start with a diagonal stitch from bottom left to top right.

Then, come up slightly to the left of the top of the stitch – but not as far as where you started.

The stitch a straight stitch from top left to bottom right, as in the picture below – you can see that the two stitches cross at the top.





Stitch another straight stitch in the original direction -
always remember to start it just slightly back from the end of the first stitch.

What you're trying to achieve is an even-ness in both the length of the stitches and the small
crosses

Stitch to the end of your line. What you're left with is a series of even stitches crossed at the
top and the bottom.
